Dr. Thomas Frieden, director of the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) visited Puerto Rico on March 7-8, 2016. During his visit to the UPR Medical Sciences Campus (UPR-MSC), Dr. Frieden called Zika a "tremendous chal-

lenge and crisis" and said protecting pregnant women from the virus is a top priority. "The Zika is a great challenge. Every day we learn more of the Zika". Other priorities include controlling the vector and the promotion of access to voluntary contraception. Cases of Zika are increasing weekly in Puerto



Rico, and the CDC expects hundreds of thousands of individuals will become infected, including thousands of pregnant women, indicated
