# **NIMHD GRANT AWARD**



Dr. Carlos Rodriguez, Associate Professor at the UPR-MSC School of Public Health and a participant of the RCMI Faculty Development Program, will be collaborating in a \$9.3 million award from the National Institute on Minority Health and Health Disparities (NIMHD)

for an innovative study of eHealth interventions to prevent HIV among adolescent men who have sex with men (AMSM). The study is led by Dr. Brian Mustanski, at Northwestern University. Other collaborating institutions include Hunter College and North Carolina State University. The project emphasizes inclusion of racial/ethnic minority groups and populations that experience health disparities.

Dr. Emma Fernandez-Repollet, Professor and Principal Investigator of the Collaborative Center for Health Disparities at the UPR-MSC, participated on the visit of the

External Review Committee (ERC) to the Institute for Health Disparities Research (IHDR) at the University of Texas at San Antonio (UTSA) on August 19, 2016. The IHDR is directed by Dr. Thankam Sunil, whose understanding of the health issues of the region is an asset to the institute and UTSA. The Institute focuses on areas of health disparities in South Texas in which participating investigators can make significant and unique contributions. Other ERC members included Dr. Steve Murdock, Professor and Director of the Hobby Center for the Study of Texas at Rice University and Dr. Robert Kirken, Dean of the College of Science and Principal Investigator of the Border Biomedical Research Center at the University of Texas at El Paso. The ERC met leadership officials, IHRD researchers, staff and students who demonstrated their commitment to their research and institute responsibilities.

The Center for Collaborative Research in Health Disparities (CCRHD) received the visit of Dr. Tim Dye, director of the Global and Territorial

Global Health Research Network (GTHRN) at the University of Rochester.
